- 4. How did the reformers of Antebellum Era (pre-Civil war) believe that public education could make the democracy of the United States more effective?
- 5. What was the Common School Movement? What were the goals of the Common School Movement?
- 6. What factors contribute to middle class women playing an increased role in reform movements during the Antebellum (pre-Civil war) Era?
- 7. What limitations (political, economic, and social) did women in the Antebellum Era (pre-Civil war) face?
- 8. Who were the organizers of the Seneca Falls Convention and what were the goals of the Convention?
- 9. What was the purpose of the 'Declaration of Sentiments'? What document was the Declaration of Sentiments modeled after?

- 13. What were the three major Abolitionist groups of the 1830s 1850s? and what were their individual goals?
- 14. a) Who was William Lloyd Garrison, and what was the *Liberator?* b) How did the Grimke sisters contribute to the Abolitionist movement?
