- 4. What were German submarine attacks on Allied warships and any commercial ships, including neutral countries called? Did the Germans limit their submarine attacks to only commercial ships?
- 5. What ship was sunk that to Pres. Wilson issuing a series of notes to Germany warning them to stop the attacks?
- 6. Why did Germany cease attacks on passenger liners?
- 7. Why did Germany decide to resume unrestricted warfare in 1916?
- 8. What did Arthur Zimmerman ask Mexico to do in the Zimmerman Telegram?
- 9. How did the United States react to the Zimmerman Telegram? How did Pres. Wilson respond?
- 10. What type of wartime boards were created to help the economy? How did private businesses help?
- 11. How the United States finance the war?
- 12. What did the Espionage Act penalize citizens for?
- 13. Describe Eugene Debs. Why was he sent to prison?
- 14. What did Blacks from the South want to escape by moving North? What was this movement known as?
- 15. Why did defense manufacturing jobs open in the North?
- 16. What was President Wilson's plan for creating lasting peace was known as?
- 17. Name 3-5 parts of Wilson's plan.
- 18. The Treaty of Versailles including a provision to create a League of Nations. What did Pres. Wilson fight so hard for the League's creation?
- 19. Why did isolationists vote against the US joining the League of Nations? What main Senator led the opposition to the US joining the League?
- 20. Did the United States join the League of Nations?
